## **Library Board Minutes**

October 9, 2023

Hoesch Memorial Library Board of Trustees met on Monday October 9, 2023 at 4:00 p.m. Present were Don Jardon, Cathy House, Bryan Lubeck, Mary Jo Radil, Pam Miller and Keri Anderson Library Director.

Don Jardon called the meeting to order with attention given to the Open Meeting Act posted on the conference room wall.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read. The motion to approve the minutes as written was made by Cathy and seconded by Mary Jo. Motion carried.

Warrants for payment of bills were reviewed. Mary Jo made the motion to approve the warrants for payment and Don provided the second. Motion carried.

Our normal policy is no charge for use of the meeting room, but discussed charging a \$50 deposit which would be returned if no damage, and \$20 per session since there is a charge for attending the class.
